Overnight Detours Planned for Next Week at the I-95/I-295 North Interchange

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – FDOT will have multiple overnight closures and detours throughout the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvements project beginning Sunday, May 12 through Thursday, May 16 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. for roadway and bridge construction operations, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Please note that times may be adjusted to avoid conflicting detour traffic along the routes.

Closures and detour routes:

- **I-295 East to I-95 North closed:** Drivers will detour to U.S. 17 and take Airport Road to connect with I-95 North.
- **I-295 West exit to I-95 North closed:** Drivers will detour to U.S. 17 and take Airport Road to connect with I-95 North.
- **I-295 West closed:** Drivers will detour to I-95 North to the Airport Road exit and take I-95 South to reconnect with I-295 West.
- **I-295 East closed:** Drivers will detour to I-95 South to the Busch Drive exit and take I-95 North to reconnect with I-295 East.

This work is part of a new phase of construction on the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvements project. The interchange upgrades are part of an important effort to promote economic growth and development in the region.
