The Florida Department of Transportation welcomes you to tonight's public meeting to discuss proposed improvements to the Edison Avenue Bridge over McCoy's Creek in Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida.

This project will replace the existing 2 lane bridge with a new bridge with two 12 foot travel lanes, 5 foot shoulders and a 5 foot sidewalk on the north side of the bridge. During construction, a temporary bridge will be installed on the north side to maintain vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

FDOT will be constructing a temporary acrow bridge in order to complete the construction of a new bridge and not disrupt traffic flow. Acrow bridges used as detours around road construction sites address two major issues. By providing a temporary roadway, traffic disruptions are reduced while the safety of motorists and construction workers is enhanced. Detour bridges have also been shown to reduce construction costs and help increase productivity.



Edison Avenue Bridge

The Edison Avenue Bridge was built in 1929.

It is included in the 2004 and 2012 edition of Historic Highway Bridges of Florida.

While not individually eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, the Edison Avenue Bridge is a contributing resource to the potential North Riverside Historic District and a contributing element to the McCoys Creek Improvement Project Bridge Resource Group.

The proposed bridge design will match:

- The existing sidewalk railing (located on the outside of the sidewalk).
- The existing historic railings (located at the outside edge of shoulders).

The proposed railings adjacent to the shoulders will be crash-worthy.

The pedestrian railing will be made to FDOT Standards.

The proposed bridge will be constructed to today's FDOT standards but will keep the appearance of the existing bridge, thereby preserving the historic character important of the community.
