

Proposed Project

The proposed project would connect Clark Butler Boulevard with the southern end of SW 52nd Street, a length of 0.8 miles. The proposed roadway would consist of two 11-foot travel lanes, 7-foot buffered bicycle lanes on each side and a 10-foot multi-use path on the east side (see Figure 1 below).



The proposed project would include a bridge over Hogtown Creek (see Figure 2 below) and two stormwater ponds. Additional right-of-way would be required to construct the project. Right-of-way specialists are available to answer any questions that you may have.
