

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation is considering changes to the intersection of Southside Boulevard and Gate Parkway. Proposed improvements include adding a northbound and southbound auxiliary lane on Southside Boulevard between Butler Boulevard (S.R. 202) and Gate Parkway; adding a third westbound to southbound left turn lane on Gate Parkway; adding a second northbound to eastbound right turn lane on Southside Boulevard; displacing/rerouting southbound to eastbound left turns from Southside Boulevard to Gate Parkway to a new signalized intersection approximately 500 feet south of Gate Parkway; displacing/rerouting all approaching traffic from Gate Parkway West to a new signalized intersection approximately 500 feet south of Gate Parkway; and reducing the phasing and cycle length of the existing traffic signal at Southside Boulevard and Gate Parkway. These improvements will enhance intersection operations by reducing signal phasing and improve safety by reducing vehicle conflict points.

Project documents will be available for review at the public hearing and at www.nflroads.com by December 5, 2019. Persons wishing to submit written statements or other exhibits in place of or in addition to oral statements may do so at the hearing or by sending them to Peter Osborne, 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Exhibits or statements postmarked by December 22, 2019 will become part of the public record.
