### **Improvements to Interstate 75 White Springs Weigh Stations Underway** *Work is currently underway at the southbound weigh station.*

**WHITE SPRINGS, Fla.** – A Florida Department of Transportation project will enhance lighting and include other improvements at the Interstate 75 weigh stations in Hamilton County.

Work has started at the southbound weigh station.

The project consists of enhanced lighting, electrical, and other incidental construction on the northbound and southbound weigh stations. During construction, motorists can expect to see few traffic impacts. However, signage will be posted to designate weigh station closures.

SICE, Inc. is expected to complete this \$1.64 million improvement project in spring 2021.

The Florida Department of Transportation urges motorists to always follow the speed limit and stay within the limits of orange cones and barrels while traveling through construction zones.
