# Travel Advisory: State Road 200 Lane Closure Schedule

**Yulee, Fla.** – This advisory is to inform community leaders and interested parties about upcoming scheduled lane closures, traffic shifts and other construction activity on State Road 200/A1A. For a complete list of scheduled lane closures in northeast Florida, interested parties may visit <u>www.NFLRoads.com/TrafficReport</u>.

Drivers can also set up real-time traffic alerts from FL511, a free service offered by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). Motorists can visit <u>www.FL511.com</u> or call #511 for this up-to-date information.

The Florida Department of Transportation has permitted multiple lane closures as part of the State Road 200/A1A improvement projects. Below are several lane closures planned for October 16 through October 23, weather permitting. Certain activities may require unexpected lane closures for the safety of both drivers and construction workers.

#### Daytime lane closures:

Interstate 95: None at this time.

## State Road 200:

• The westbound left lane of State Road 200 from Nassau Place to Chester Road is expected to be closed Saturday, October 17 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

#### Nighttime lane closures:

Interstate 95: None at this time.

#### State Road 200:

• The eastbound right or left lane of State Road 200 from Harper Chapel Road to Still Quarters Road is expected to be closed beginning Sunday, October 18 through Thursday, October 22 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. This is an alternating closure with only one lane closed at a time.

- The intersection of State Road 200 and Arrigo Boulevard is expected to be closed Tuesday, October 20 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- The intersection of State Road 200 and Blackrock Road is expected to be closed Wednesday, October 21 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- The intersection of State Road 200 and Barnwell Road is expected to be closed Thursday, October 22 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- The intersection of State Road 200 and Old Nassauville Road is expected to be closed Friday, October 23 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
