### **Atlantic Boulevard Median Modification Construction Beginning Tonight**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Tonight, the Florida Department of Transportation begins median modifications in two locations along Atlantic Boulevard (State Road 10), near the intersection of with Century 21 Drive/Acme Street and from Monument Road to Anniston Road.

Improvements under this project include related milling and resurfacing and installation of traffic separators, striping and signage.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. No lane closures will be allowed between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m.

Preferred Materials, Inc. is expected to complete this \$1.1 million improvement project in fall 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
