Bridge Rehabilitation Work on U.S. 17, State Road 16 to Begin June 13

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – Bridge rehabilitation projects on U.S. 17 (State Road 15) over Johnson Slough and State Road 16 over the Black Creek North Fork are expected to begin June 13.

Orion Marine Construction, Inc. was selected to complete the \$808,000 project, which includes installation of bridge pile jackets, spall repairs and other incidental construction. Construction is expected to be completed in spring 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Construction activities will take place primarily during daytime hours Monday through Friday. On U.S. 17 (State Road 15) over Johnson Slough, no northbound lane closures will be permitted from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. Monday through Friday; no southbound lane closures will be permitted from 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Friday; and no multi-lane closures will be permitted at any time. On State Road 16 over Black Creek, single lane closures will be permitted at any time in one direction only; no multi-lane closures will be permitted. Channels will remain open for marine traffic at all times.
