## Brief Overnight Ramp Closures Next Week for I-95 Resurfacing Work

**ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla.** – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s (FDOT) resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, the I-95 entrance and ramps at S.R. 16 and S.R. 207 will close intermittently Sunday, March 27 through Thursday, March 31 nightly from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. The intermittent ramp closures are necessary to complete milling and paving work safely.

Drivers should adhere to posted construction signs for safety and follow posted detours when in place.

Anderson Columbia Co., Inc. is expected to complete the \$30.2 million improvements by fall 2023. Construction completion dates are fluid and subject to change based on weather and schedule permitting.

March is bicycle safety month. When cycling always wear a helmet and ride in the same direction of traffic on the street. Obey all traffic signs, signals, and markings.
