Brief Overnight Closures Planned for I-95 South Ramps Next Week

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, intermittent ramp closures will be in place for the southbound entrance and exit ramps at State Road 16 and State Road 207 November 15 through November 19 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. These brief overnight rolling closures will allow crews to safely resurface the right lane of I-95 southbound within the project limits.

State Road 16:

On Monday, November 15 , the I-95 southbound exit ramp to State Road 16 and the I-95 southbound entrance ramp from State Road 16 will be closed to traffic intermittently from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Drivers attempting to exit from I-95 southbound at State Road 16 will be detoured south to the State Road 207 exit back onto I-95 northbound, where they can exit onto State Road 16.

Drivers attempting to enter I-95 southbound from State Road 16 will be detoured onto I-95 northbound to the International Golf Parkway exit, where they can access I-95 southbound (see map 1).

State Road 207:

On Thursday, November 18 , the I-95 southbound exit ramp to State Road 207 and the I-95 southbound entrance ramp from State Road 207 will be closed to traffic intermittently from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Drivers attempting to exit I-95 southbound at State Road 207 will be detoured south to the State Road 206 exit back onto I-95 northbound, where they can access State Road 207.




