

Broward Road Ramp to I-95 Southbound Closed Overnight Tuesday

Overnight lane closures on Zoo Parkway also scheduled Sunday through Tuesday

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The I-95 southbound on-ramp from Broward Road will be closed overnight Tuesday, February 22 from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Broward Road traffic will detour east on Zoo Parkway to the Main Street (U.S. 17) interchange to access I-95 southbound. (Detour and closure shown in map below.)



Drivers should also expect multiple overnight lane closures on Zoo Parkway from Main Street to Broward Road Sunday, February 20 through Tuesday, February 22.
