County Road 220 Detour, Traffic Shift Planned for August 7

MIDDLEBURG, Fla. – As part of construction related to the First Coast Expressway (State Road 23), County Road 220 will be closed from 11 a.m. Sunday, August 7 until 5 a.m. Monday, August 8 to allow for installation of drainage pipe under the roadway, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Traffic will be detoured to State Road 21 between CR 220 and Baxley Road (shown in the map below).



During the closure, crews will also implement a lane shift on County Road 220 between Baxley Road and State Road 21. Traffic will be shifted onto temporary asphalt just north of the existing roadway to allow for utility work on the south side of the roadway.
