## Daytime Detour of Sanctuary Parkway Scheduled March 7

**JACKSONVILLE BEACH, Fla.** – As part of the J. Turner Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) from the Intracoastal Waterway Bridge to Third Street (State Road A1A) resurfacing project, a detour of Sanctuary Parkway is scheduled Friday, March 7 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The closure of Sanctuary Parkway from South Beach Parkway to the Butler Boulevard westbound on-ramp is necessary for paving work to be completed safely.

Drivers are advised to follow detour signs and use extra caution while driving in the area.

Preferred Materials, Inc. was awarded the contract to complete this \$6.5 million project, which includes milling and resurfacing the roadway as well as base work, shoulder treatment, lighting, highway signing and other incidental construction. Completion is expected in summer 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
