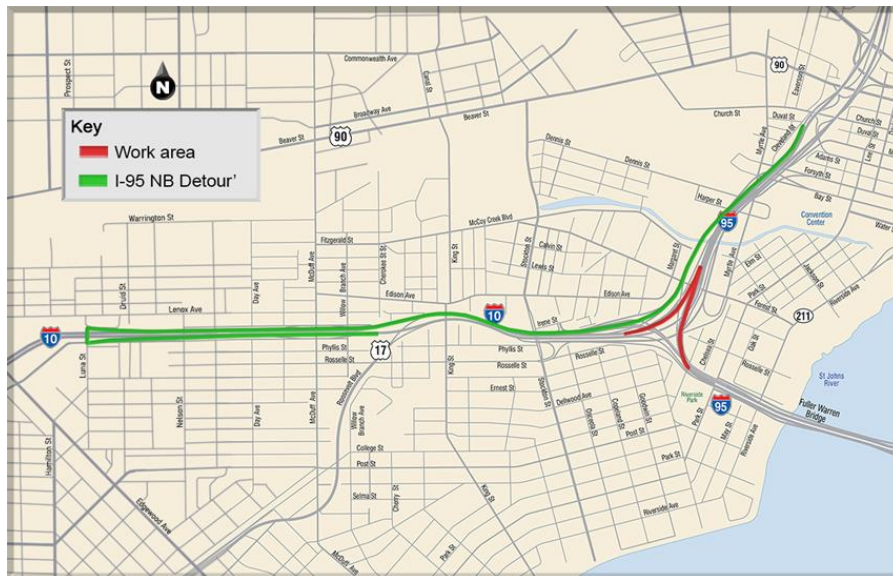

Detours Planned for This Weekend at the I-10/I-95 Operational Improvements Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of bridge construction activities for the Florida Department of Transportation’s I-10/I-95 Operational Improvements project, overnight detours of I-95 north and I-95 south approaching downtown are planned for this weekend, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

I-95 South: Saturday, September 11 from 9:15 p.m. to 8:30 a.m., drivers on I-95 south will be detoured at exit 352D towards I-10, continue on I-10 west and take the Luna Street exit, turn left on Luna Street, left on the I-10 east on-ramp and continue on I-10 to rejoin I-95 south as shown in the map below.



I-95 North: Friday, September 10 from 10:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. and Saturday, September 11 from 10:30 p.m. to 8:30 a.m., drivers on I-95 north will be detoured to the Acosta Bridge, right on Broad Street and left on Adams Street to reconnect with I-95
