## Detours Scheduled from July 26 to Aug. 1 as Part of FDOT's I-10 Widening Project

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of FDOT's I-10 from I-295 to I-95 widening project, closures and detours are scheduled at multiple interchanges within the project limits beginning Friday, July 26 while crews perform bridge construction operations, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Closure scheduled Friday, July 26 from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. the following morning:

• Irene Street on-ramp to I-10 West: Drivers will detour to Edison Avenue and take Forest Street to connect with I-10 West.

Closures scheduled Sunday, July 28 through Thursday, Aug. 1 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning:

- I-10 West exit to U.S. 17 (Roosevelt Boulevard) closed: Drivers will detour to the McDuff Avenue exit and turn left on McDuff Avenue to connect with Roosevelt Boulevard.
- Irene Street on-ramp to I-10 West: Drivers will detour to Edison Avenue and take Forest Street to connect with I-10 West.
- I-10 East exit to McDuff Avenue closed: Drivers will detour to Stockton Street, to Irene Street, to Edison Avenue, to Forest Street and take I-10 West to connect with McDuff Avenue.

Closures scheduled Sunday, July 28 through Tuesday, July 30 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning:

- I-10 West exit to Lane Avenue closed: Drivers will detour to I-295 North, to Commonwealth Avenue, to I-295 South and take I-10 East to connect with Lane Avenue.
- **McDuff Avenue on-ramp to I-10 East closed:** Drivers will detour to Rosselle Street and take Stockton Street to connect with I-10 East.

Closures scheduled Wednesday, July 31 and Thursday, Aug. 1 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning:
