Detours Planned Next Week for Westbound State Road 100 and Eastbound Frontage Road

STARKE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, the eastbound Frontage Road and westbound State Road 100 will have detours next week for bridge painting, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Eastbound Frontage Road Daytime Detours between June 26, 29 and 30: The Eastbound Frontage Road will be closed between Walnut Street and Church Street. Eastbound traffic will detour south on Walnut Street, east on South Street, south on Cherry Street and east on to Laura Street onto State Road 100. This detour will be in place from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on June 26, June 29 and June 30.

Eastbound Frontage Road Nightly Detours June 26, 27 and 28: The Eastbound Frontage Road will be closed between Walnut Street and Church Street. Eastbound traffic will detour south on Walnut Street, east on South Street, south on Cherry Street and east on to Laura Street onto State Road 100. This detour will be in place nightly from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. on June 26, June 27 and June 28.

Westbound State Road 100 Nightly Detours June 26, 27 and 28: All westbound State Road 100 through traffic will detour via Southeast 144th Street to U.S. 301. All westbound State Road 100 local traffic between Southeast 144th Street and Water Street will be detoured right onto Water Street, left on Call Street (Street Road 230), left on Walnut Street and right on State Road 100. Church Street and Cherry Street between Call Street and State Road 100 will also be closed. Thompson Street will remain open at State Road 100 for north/south traffic. This detour will be in place nightly from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. on June 26, June 27 and June 28.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete this \$23.6 million project in late 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
