Eastbound State Road 100 to be Detoured April 25 through April 28

STARKE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, eastbound State Road 100 at Walnut Street will be closed 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily from Tuesday, April 25 until Friday, April 28, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Westbound State Road 100 will remain open with intermittent traffic stoppage with flaggers.

Drivers can expect to see two eastbound State Road 100 detours taking place. Eastbound through traffic should always follow detour signage. The first detour will direct traffic to turn right on Walnut Street, left on South Street, left on Cherry Street and proceed to State Road 100. After work is completed, the detour will shift to traffic turning right on Walnut Street, left on South Street, right on Cherry Street, left on Laura Street and proceeding to State Road 100.

A large vehicle detour remains in place for eastbound State Road 100 from U.S. 301 to Water Street. Eastbound State Road 100 large vehicle traffic will turn right onto southbound U.S. 301, then turn left onto SE 144th Avenue (Hazen Street) and continue onto SE 144th Street to State Road 100.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete this \$23.6 million project in summer 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
