Eastbound State Road 100 Traffic Shifts to New Overpass May 26

STARKE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, traffic on eastbound State Road 100 is expected to shift to the new overpass Friday, May 26, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Operations for this shift are expected to take place between 11 a.m. and 12 p.m. Eastbound SR 100 will remain open during operations, but drivers should expect temporary delays. Traffic will be controlled with flaggers and the assistance of traffic control officers.

After the shift, eastbound SR 100 traffic will use the overpass, those seeking to use the eastbound frontage road will see a long-term full closure during the next phase of construction. The detour consists of a right on Cherry Street, a left on Laura Street and proceeding to State Road 100.

Eastbound Large Vehicle State Road 230 Detour: After the traffic shift, large vehicles seeking to access SR 230 from eastbound SR 100 will be detoured north on U.S. 301, turn right on SR 16 and turn right on SR 230.

Westbound traffic will be placed onto the overpass at a later date.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete this \$23.6 million project in late 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
