FDOT Scheduled to Begin Resurfacing Project on I-10 From Nassau County Line to First Coast Expressway June 10

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Construction is expected to begin next week on the Florida Department of Transportation’s I-10 resurfacing project from the Nassau County Line to First Coast Expressway (State Road 23). Improvements under this contract consist of milling and resurfacing of almost 9 miles of I-10, shoulder treatment, drainage improvements, highway signing, guardrail construction, traffic monitoring site upgrades, bridge joint repairs, and other incidental construction.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. Drivers can expect overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday, and 7 p.m. to 8 a.m. Saturday and Sunday. Please note the speed limit on I-10 will be reduced to 60 mph during lane closures.

Hubbard Construction Company was selected to complete this resurfacing project at a cost of \$19 million by summer 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
