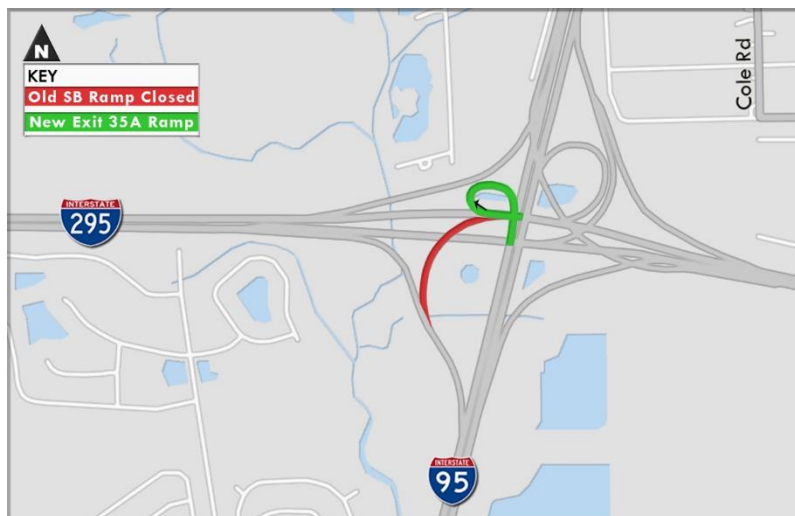

FDOT Shifting Traffic onto New I-295 WB to I-95 SB Ramp

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will shift traffic onto the new entrance to the I-295 west to I-95 southbound ramp this Sunday, March 6.

As shown in the map below, drivers will be able to enter the new ramp from the right lane adjacent to the old entrance ramp.



This traffic shift is necessary for roadway construction operations as part of the I-95/I-295 North Operational Improvements Project. This project is designed to reconfigure the I-95/I-295 North interchange to improve traffic flow, safety and increase capacity.
