FDOT to Hold Construction Open House for I-10 Widening Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host an open house Thursday, February 4 from 4:30 to 6 p.m. to share information and answer questions regarding the I-10 widening project from west of I-295 to I-95.

Citizens who are unable to participate virtually or by phone may attend the open house in person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project documents and information on how to participate online are available at <u>nflroads.com/COH</u>.

The project will add two general purpose lanes in each direction between I-295 and I-95, construct noise barriers at prescribed locations, reconfigure exits to reduce weaving and widen bridges at 19 locations.

FDOT hired Superior Construction to complete this \$176 million project in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.


