FDOT to Hold Open House for Southside Boulevard at Gate Parkway Intersection Improvements Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host an open house Tuesday, May 25 from 4 to 6 p.m. to share information and answer questions regarding the upcoming intersection improvements project.

Citizens who are unable to participate virtually or by phone may attend the open house in person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project documents and information on how to participate online are available at <u>nflroads.com/COH</u>.

The project will reduce congestion and wait times at the Southside Boulevard at Gate Parkway intersection through a series of additional lanes, improved signal timing, and reconfiguration of the intersection.

FDOT hired Watson Civil Construction to complete this \$7.4 million project fall 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
