FDOT to Host Hybrid Meeting Next Week for Sidewalk Improvements in Fernandina Beach

FERNANDINA BEACH, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting Tuesday, May 28 to discuss the replacement of existing sidewalk on Atlantic Avenue between 8th and 10th Streets and on the north side of Atlantic Avenue east of 9th Street. The purpose of this modification is to improve safety and provide an uninterrupted pedestrian walkway.

The meeting will take place virtually and in-person at Fernandina Beach City Hall, 204 Ash Street, Fernandina Beach, FL 32034. FDOT staff and consultants will be available from 4:30 to 6 p.m. to answer questions and accept comments.
