FDOT to Host June 20 Hybrid Access Management Public Meeting for Proposed Changes to U.S. 1 and Marion Street Intersection

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting Thursday, June 20 to discuss proposed access management changes to the intersection of U.S. 1 and Marion Street.

The meeting will take place virtually and in-person at the St. Johns County Public Library System Main Branch located at 1960 N. Ponce De Leon Boulevard, St. Augustine Beach, Florida 32084. FDOT staff and consultants will be available from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. to answer questions and comments. A formal presentation and public comment period will begin at 6 p.m.
