FDOT to Host Public Meeting Next Week for Proposed Coastal Highway Improvements

VILANO BEACH, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting to discuss proposed improvements on Coastal Highway from the State Road A1A Intersection to 24th Street.

FDOT proposes the following improvements to Coastal Highway:

- An 8-foot-wide trail for pedestrians and cyclists
- Drainage improvements in various locations to improve roadway flooding

A virtual public meeting will be held Wednesday, April 9, 2025, with an informal open house from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. and a formal presentation and public comment period beginning at 6 p.m. Information about participation is available at www.nflroads.com/VPH.

An in-person meeting will be held Thursday, April 10, 2025, at GTM Research Reserve 505 Guana River Rd, Ponte Vedra Beach, FL 32082. An informal open house will be held from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m., with a formal presentation and public comment period beginning at 6 p.m.

Public meetings provide the public with an opportunity to express their views on the project, its potential for impact and other related matters. All participants, regardless of the platform they choose, will receive the same information on the proposed project and all comments received in-person, virtually, or electronically will be given equal consideration.
