FDOT to Host State Road 211 from St. Johns Avenue to Marquette Avenue Parking Reconfiguration Access Management Public Meeting

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a hybrid public meeting Tuesday, August 29 to discuss proposed parking improvements on State Road 211 between St. Johns Avenue and Marquette Avenue.

These parking improvements are part of a resurfacing project on State Road 211 from San Juan Avenue to I-95, currently expected to start in summer 2024. Under the proposed design, FDOT is considering a reconfiguration of parking that would increase access to businesses, calm traffic and improve safety for all road users.

The hybrid public meeting will be held Tuesday, August 29 beginning at 4:30 p.m. at the FDOT Jacksonville Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project staff will be available to answer questions and accept comments in-person, online at nflroads.com/VPH or by phone at (415) 930-5321, access code 366-212-428.

Citizens may drop by anytime between 4:30 and 6 p.m. to learn more about the proposed parking reconfiguration, offer input and view conceptual renderings of the proposal. A formal presentation and public comment period for both in-person and virtual participants will begin at 6 p.m.
