

### FDOT Shifting Traffic onto New I-295 EB to I-95 SB Exit Ramp

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation will shift traffic onto the newly constructed I-295 eastbound to I-95 southbound exit ramp Thursday, December 16 as part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvements Project.

Construction crews will begin the traffic shift at 10 p.m. Drivers will take the new exit ramp from I-295 eastbound, located approximately one mile west of the old exit ramp near the Biscayne overpass, to connect with I-95 southbound. This shift will not impact I-95 northbound drivers.



This work is part of FDOT's I-95/I-295 North Interchange Project designed to reconfigure the I-95/I-295 North interchange to improve traffic flow, safety and increase capacity by moving vehicles through the interchange with fewer lane shifts.
