FDOT to Host August 11 Hybrid Construction Open House for Upcoming S.R. 312 Extension Project

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation is scheduled to host a hybrid construction open house Thursday, August 11 from 4 to 6 p.m. to discuss the upcoming S.R. 312 extension project from S.R. 207 to South Holmes Boulevard.

Project staff will be available to answer questions online at nflroads.com/VPH or by phone at (213) 929-4212 (enter access code 136-396-733).

Citizens who are unable to participate virtually may attend the open house in person at the St. Johns County Administrative Auditorium located at 500 San Sebastian View, St. Augustine, Florida 32084.

FDOT staff and project team members will be available from 4 to 6 p.m. to answer questions and accept comments. This meeting is informal. No presentation will be provided.

This one-mile segment will be constructed as a two-lane rural roadway with at-grade connections at State Road 207 and South Holmes Boulevard. The southern segment proposed on State Road 312 extends from State Road 207 to State Road 16 (4 miles) and is currently in the design phase. The proposed northern segment extends from State Road 16 to U.S. 1/State Road 5 and is currently not funded.

P & S Paving Inc. is estimated to complete the new \$12 million roadway extension project by late 2023. Construction completion times are estimates and subject to change based on weather and unforeseen circumstances.


