FDOT to Host December 16 Hybrid Public Meeting for Edgewood Avenue Roadway Improvements Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting inviting citizen input and questions regarding a proposed reconfiguration of the Edgewood Avenue and Plymouth Street intersection to reduce conflict points and improve traffic flow for drivers attempting to enter or exit onto U.S. 17. These proposed improvements are part of the Edgewood Avenue Roadway Improvements project (FIN 443517-1).

The hybrid public meeting will be held Thursday, December 16 at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project staff will be available to answer questions and accept comments online at nflroads.com/VPH or by phone at (914) 614-3221, access code 138-562-764.

Citizens may drop by anytime between 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. to learn more about the scope of the project, offer input and view conceptual renderings of the project. A formal public comment period for both virtual and in-person participants will begin at 6:30 p.m.
