### **FDOT to Host May 18 Hybrid Construction Open House Highlighting Edgewood Avenue Roadway Improvements**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a construction open house inviting the community to learn more about the upcoming resurfacing project taking place on Edgewood Avenue South from Roosevelt Boulevard to Cassat Avenue. Improvements will include the construction of a roundabout-style traffic configuration at the intersection of Edgewood Avenue and Plymouth Street, bike lanes, shared use lane markings, mid-block crossings, signals, sidewalks and signage upgrades.

The hybrid construction open house will be held Thursday, May 18 at the FDOT Jacksonville Urban Office Training Center, located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204.
