FDOT to Host Public Kickoff Meeting Next Week for Proposed Improvements to I-95 from I-10 to Beaver Street

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will hold a public kickoff meeting to discuss proposed improvements to I-95 from I-10 to Beaver Street. The meeting will be held virtually on Tuesday, August 2 and in person on Thursday, August 4.

On Tuesday, August 2 from 6 to 7:30 p.m., citizens who would like to participate virtually can register online at nflroads.com/VPH or join by phone at (213) 929-4212 using access code 523-657-785.

The in-person meeting will be held on Thursday, August 4, with an open house from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. followed by a public comment period at 6:30 p.m. at the FDOT Jacksonville Urban Office Training Center, 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Department personnel will be available to discuss project details and answer questions.

Both virtual and in-person participants will be given equal opportunity to ask questions and make oral statements. Project information is now available for review at nflroads.com/i95.

Improvements being considered along the corridor include:

- The addition of up to two 12-foot travel lanes in each direction on I-95.
- Myrtle Avenue Bridge (Bridge No. 720163) deck replacement and rehabilitation.
- Intersection and roadway improvements at Church Street, Beaver Street and West Union Street.
- Potential changes in access to and from I-95.

A Project Development & Environment Study is currently underway to evaluate alternatives to improve safety, capacity and traffic operations on I-95. The purpose of
