FDOT to Host Public Meetings Next Week for Proposed Improvements to I-95 from I-10 to Beaver Street

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host two public meetings inviting citizen input and questions regarding proposed modifications as part of an improvement project on I-95 from I-10 to north of Beaver Street. The proposed project will rehabilitate and replace the deck of the Myrtle Avenue Bridge as well as add up to two 12-foot travel lanes in each direction on I-95.

The virtual public meeting will take place Tuesday, Jan. 31. Interested parties are invited to participate in a virtual open house from 5:30 p.m. until 6 p.m. where questions may be asked of project staff. At 6 p.m. a formal presentation will begin, and public comments will be accepted. The in-person public meeting will be held Thursday, Feb. 2 at the FDOT Jacksonville Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Interested parties are welcomed to attend an open house between 4:30 and 6 p.m. to learn more about the scope of the project, offer input and view conceptual renderings of the project. A formal presentation and public comment period for in-person participants will begin at 6 p.m.

Both virtual and in-person participants will be given equal opportunity to ask questions and make oral statements. Project information is now available for review at www.nflroads.com/i95.
