I-95 and Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Interchange Improvement Project Begins Construction Next Month, Open House August 9

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Construction on an interchange improvement project at the intersection of I-95 and State Road 115 (Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway) in downtown Jacksonville is scheduled to begin next month.

Webber, LLC was selected to complete the \$79.8 project, which includes milling and resurfacing, shoulder treatment, drainage upgrades, new traffic signals and lighting. Improvements under this project also include constructing a new, higher-clearance bridge over Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway, new noise walls and replacing the pedestrian bridge.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a construction open house for the I-95 and Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Interchange Improvement Project Wednesday, August 9 at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center, 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. The informal open house will give the public the opportunity to learn about the upcoming project and discuss details with FDOT staff and engineers.

Interested citizens may drop by anytime between 4:30 and 6 p.m. to view project maps and talk with the project team. The open house will also be accessible online at nflroads.com/vph or by phone at (631) 992-3221, access code 577-528-065.


Motorists can expect lane closures and possible detours within the project limits between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday and 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Friday through Sunday. Completion is estimated in early 2027, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
