ICYMI: FDOT to Host Hybrid Public Meeting for Proposed Access Management Improvements on U.S. 1

SAINT AUGUSTINE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a hybrid public meeting to discuss proposed access management improvements at U.S. 1 and Nix Boat Yard Road as part of the U.S. 1 from the Moultrie Creek Bridge to Marion Street resurfacing project.

FDOT proposes the following improvements:

- Median modifications to the intersection of U.S. 1 and Nix Boat Yard Road
- Roadway resurfacing
- Curb and gutter work
- Other incidental construction

A virtual and in-person public meeting will be held Tuesday, Jan. 9, 2025 at the St. Johns County Public Library Main Branch, 1960 N. Ponce De Leon Blvd., St. Augustine, FL 32084.
