## Lane and Ramp Closures on Eastbound I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295 Scheduled June 10 to June 16

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Drivers can expect nightly lane and ramp closures on eastbound I-10 from Chaffee Road to I-295 Monday, June 10 to Sunday, June 16 for milling and resurfacing. Nightly lane closures throughout the corridor are expected from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

On Sunday, June 9, the I-10 eastbound ramp to Hammond Boulevard will be closed for resurfacing. To access Hammond Boulevard, drivers will continue east on I-10 to Lane Avenue and take I-10 westbound back to Hammond Boulevard.

On Tuesday, June 11, the northbound Hammond Boulevard ramp to eastbound I-10 will be closed for resurfacing. To access I-10, Hammond Boulevard northbound drivers will take US 90 east to Lane Avenue and go souh to access I-10.

On Monday, June 12, the southbound Hammond Boulevard ramp to eastbound I-10 will be closed for resurfacing. To access I-10, southbound Hammond Boulevard drivers will take Normandy Boulevard east to Lane Avenue and go north to access I-10.

Anderson Columbia was awarded the \$26 million project to complete resurfacing on I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295. This project is expected to be completed by mid-2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
