### **Lane and Ramp Closures on Eastbound I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295 Scheduled June 17 to June 23**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Drivers can expect nightly lane and ramp closures on I-10 from Hammond Boulevard to I-295 Monday, June 17 to Sunday, June 23 for milling and resurfacing. Nightly lane closures throughout the corridor are expected from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

On Sunday, June 16, the I-10 eastbound ramp to I-295 will be closed for resurfacing. Drivers will continue east to Lane Avenue and use I-10 westbound to access I-295.

On Monday, June 17, the southbound I-295 ramp to I-10 east will be closed for resurfacing. Drivers on I-295 will continue south to Normandy Boulevard (SR 228) and take Normandy Boulevard to I-295 northbound to access I-10 eastbound.

On Tuesday, June 18, the northbound I-295 ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed for resurfacing. Drivers on I-295 will continue north to Commonwealth Avenue, exit at Commonwealth Avenue and use the ramp to I-295 southbound to enter I-10 westbound.

On Wednesday, June 19 and Thursday, June 20, the southbound I-295 ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed for resurfacing. Drivers on southbound I-295 will take the exit for I-10 eastbound and exit at Lane Avenue to access westbound I-10.

Anderson Columbia was awarded the \$26 million project to complete resurfacing on I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295. This project is expected to be completed by mid-2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
