Long-term Detour Planned at the Arlington Expressway North Service Road Bridge Over Red Bay Branch

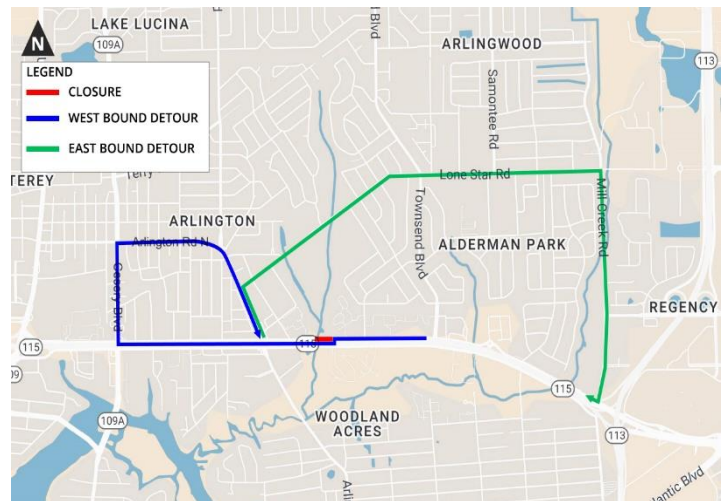
JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of a resurfacing project on Arlington Expressway (State Road 115) from Mathews Bridge to Southside Boulevard, a detour of the Arlington Expressway North Service Road bridge over Red Bay Branch is expected to begin early March and continue through July 2024 while crews perform bridge construction operations. During the closure, traffic will be detoured as follows:

North Service Road Westbound Detour:

Drivers will detour via westbound Arlington Expressway, northbound Cesery Boulevard, eastbound Arlington Road, and southbound N. Arlington Road to access the North Service Road.

North Service Road Eastbound Detour:

Drivers will detour via northbound Arlington Road north, eastbound Lillian/Lone Star Road, and southbound on Mill Creek Road to access the North Service Road. The Arlington Expressway will remain open to traffic in both directions.



Superior Construction is expected to complete the \$26 million project in summer 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
