Main Street Bridge to be Detoured Nightly Sept. 26 through Sept. 30

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s bridge fender system improvements project, the Main Street Bridge will be closed nightly for work from Monday, Sept. 26 through Friday, Sept. 30, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The bridge will close at 9 p.m. each night and reopen by 6 a.m. the following day.

During closures, both vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be detoured to the Acosta Bridge. Signs will direct traffic through the detour. Marine traffic will not be impacted by the closures.

FDOT hired Seacoast Inc. to complete this \$2.1 million project with an estimated completion in early 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

A crash can occur at any moment. Whether you are traveling one mile or one thousand miles, the driver of a motor vehicle and all passengers should always wear a seatbelt. Children ages 0 through 3 must be in child restraint. Kids ages 4 through 5 must be in a separate carrier, integrated child seat or booster seat. Let’s get everyone home safe.
