Main Street at Zoo Parkway Overnight Ramp Closures Scheduled November 3 and November 4

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Ramps at the Main Street (U.S. 17) and Zoo Parkway interchange (State Road 105) are scheduled to close Wednesday, November 3 and Thursday, November 4 from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The closures are needed for construction related to the Zoo Parkway resurfacing and improvement project.

Wednesday, November 3: The Zoo Parkway westbound ramp to Main Street will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 6 a.m. Thursday. Traffic will detour via Zoo Parkway, Broward Road, Interstate Commerce Road and Clark Road. (Closure and detour shown in Map 1 below.)



Thursday, November 4: The ramp from Main Street to Zoo Parkway will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 6 a.m. Friday. Northbound Main Street traffic will detour via Gun
