Multiple Lane Closures Expected on Southbound Buckman Bridge Overnight Saturday and Sunday Morning

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Drivers on the I-295 West Beltway over the Buckman Bridge will see multi-lane closures Saturday night through Sunday morning as crews remove and replace overhead signage.

Crews will close the three inside lanes of southbound I-295 from Saturday, October 2 at 8 p.m. to Sunday, October 3 at 11 a.m. for signage improvements. The closures are necessary for the safety of both construction crews and drivers.

Drivers are encouraged to use caution, plan ahead and expect delays during the necessary lane closures.

Construction along the I-295 West Beltway at the Buckman Bridge is part of a safety initiative to convey which lanes are free flowing, slowed or blocked on the bridge. Programmable overhead electronic boards and additional CCTV cameras will be installed at several locations, on both directions of the bridge to support lane use, improve traffic flow and enhance safety.

The \$10.5 million project is expected to be completed by the end of 2021, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
