Multiple Detours Planned for This Weekend at the I-10/I-95 Operational Improvements Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of bridge construction activities for FDOT's I-10/I-95 Operational Improvements project, multiple overnight detours are scheduled for Friday, October 22 through Sunday, October 24, pending weather and unforeseen circumstances.

I-95 North Detour: Saturday, October 23 from 10:30 p.m. to 8:30 a.m., drivers on I-95 north will be detoured to the Acosta Bridge, right on Broad Street and left on Adams Street to reconnect with I-95.

I-95 South Detour: Friday, October 22 from 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. and Sunday October 24 from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Drivers on I-95 south will be detoured at exit 352D towards I-10, continue on I-10 west and take the Luna Street exit, turn left on Luna Street, left on the I-10 east on-ramp and continue on I-10 east to rejoin I-95 south.

I-95 North to I-10 Flyover Detour: Friday, October 22 and Sunday, October 24 from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., drivers on I-95 north who wish to take I-10 west will be detoured to the Park Street exit. At the bottom of the ramp, drivers will turn right on Park Street, left on Forest Street, left on Edison Avenue, left on Stockton Street and left on Irene Street to access the I-10 west ramp.

FDOT hired Archer Western to complete this \$126 million project in early 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
