

Nightly Closures Planned at Lane Avenue, Lenox Avenue Intersection Monday, June 13 through Thursday, June 16

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT’s Lane Avenue resurfacing project, a section of Lane Avenue north of the intersection with Lenox Avenue will be closed nightly for utility work from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. The work will take place nightly Monday, June 13 through Thursday, June 16, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Northbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn right onto Lenox Avenue, left onto Normandy Boulevard and proceed to Lane Avenue.

Southbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn left onto Normandy Boulevard, right onto Lenox Avenue and proceed to Lane Avenue.
