Northbound On-Ramp to Southside Connector at Regency Square Boulevard North Closed Overnight June 30

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The northbound on-ramp from Regency Square Boulevard North to Southside Connector (State Road 113) will be detoured overnight Wednesday, June 30 from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The detour is necessary for pavement work associated with the Southside Connector resurfacing and improvement project.

Drivers on Regency Square Boulevard North seeking to travel north on Southside Connector will be detoured to northbound Monument Road, turn west on Tredinick Parkway and continue to their destination via Southside Connector. Signage will direct motorists through the detour.



Motorists on Southside Connector will not be impacted.
