Overnight Closure and Traffic Shift Planned for October 3 on San Pablo Road Ramp to Westbound Butler Boulevard

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – An overnight closure and traffic shift are planned Sunday, October 3 on the San Pablo Road ramp to westbound Butler Boulevard.

The ramp will close at 8 p.m. Sunday, October 3 to allow for installation of new pavement markings. When the ramp reopens at 5 a.m. Monday, October 4, traffic will be shifted onto new asphalt and a new exit from the Mayo Clinic campus will also be open to traffic.

During the closure, traffic will be detoured eastbound on Butler Boulevard to the South Beach Parkway exit, where motorists can access westbound Butler Boulevard.
