Overnight Closure of County Road 209 Scheduled for July 19

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – As part of the First Coast Expressway project, a portion of County Road 209 will close from 9 p.m. Monday, July 19 to 5 a.m. Tuesday, July 20 for concrete bridge deck work, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

During the closure, motorists will be detoured via U.S. 17, J.P. Hall Boulevard and County Road 226 as shown in the map below.
