### Overnight Closures, Traffic Shift Planned Next Week on San Pablo Road Ramp to Westbound Butler Boulevard

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of the interchange improvement project at Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) and San Pablo Road, overnight ramp closures are planned next week for the San Pablo Road ramp to westbound Butler Boulevard.

The ramp will close at 8 p.m. Sunday, September 19 to allow for installation of new pavement markings. When the ramp reopens at 5 a.m. Monday, September 20, traffic will be shifted onto new asphalt. The ramp will close again nightly from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Wednesday, September 22 and Thursday, September 23 for barrier wall relocation.

During the closures, traffic will be detoured eastbound on Butler Boulevard to the South Beach Parkway exit, where motorists can access westbound Butler Boulevard (as shown in the map below).
