Overnight Detour of County Road 220 Planned June 17

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – As part of First Coast Expressway construction, County Road 220 from east of Middleburg High School to Baxley Road will close overnight Monday, June 17, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The roadway will close at 9 p.m. and reopen by 5 a.m. Tuesday, June 18. During the closure, through traffic will detour via Blanding Boulevard (State Road 21) and Baxley Road. Access will remain available to local traffic.
