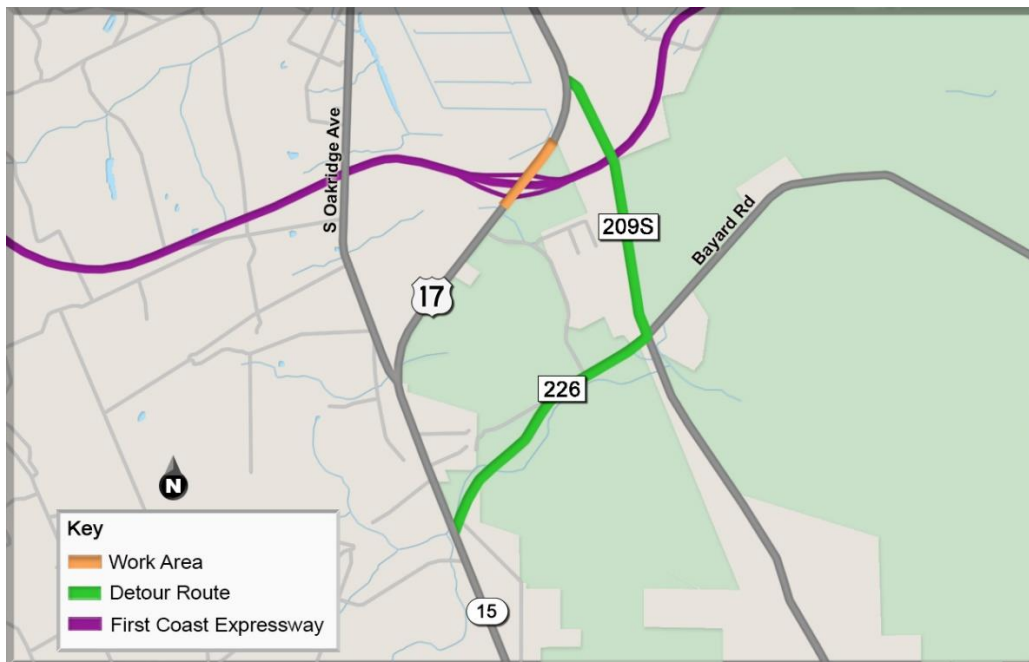

Overnight Detours of U.S. 17 Planned March 5 and March 9

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – As part of the First Coast Expressway project, a segment of U.S. 17 north of County Road 15A will close from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly for bridge deck work Friday, March 5 and Tuesday, March 9, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

During the closure, motorists traveling on U.S. 17 will be detoured approximately three miles via Bayard Road and County Road 209 as shown in the map below.
