Overnight Detours Planned Next Week at Butler Boulevard and Kernan Boulevard Interchange

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the interchange improvement project at J.T. Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) and Kernan Boulevard, overnight ramp closures are planned Wednesday, June 12 and Thursday, June 13 for paving and striping activities.

The following detours are planned nightly from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. the following morning, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Ramp from westbound Butler Boulevard to Kernan Boulevard closed Wednesday, June 12 and Thursday, June 13: Drivers will continue on westbound Butler Boulevard, take I-295 North to Beach Boulevard (U.S. 90) and travel east on Beach Boulevard to access Kernan Boulevard.

Ramp from Kernan Boulevard to westbound Butler Boulevard and I-295 closed Wednesday, June 12 and Thursday, June 13: Drivers will take eastbound Butler Boulevard to Hodges Boulevard to access westbound Butler Boulevard.

Alternating lanes of westbound Butler Boulevard from just east of Kernan Boulevard to just west of I-295 will also be closed nightly from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sunday, June 9 through Thursday, June 13 for milling, paving and striping.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete the \$17.1 million project, which includes construction of a partial cloverleaf interchange, adding capacity to ramps, milling and resurfacing existing pavement, roadway lighting improvements, drainage improvements and installation of new signage and mast arm signals. Completion is expected in late 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
