Overnight Detours Planned Next Week for I-95 at Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Interchange Improvement Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of an interchange improvement project on Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway and I-95, nightly lane closures and detours are scheduled from Monday, June 3 to Sunday, June 9 for paving and traffic switch repair operations.

I-95 Southbound from MLK Eastbound Detour

The on-ramp to I-95 southbound from Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway eastbound will be closed nightly starting Monday, June 3 through Sunday, June 9 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. for paving operations.

As a detour, drivers will take MLK eastbound to the Boulevard Street exit to the westbound MLK on-ramp, onto the I-95 southbound on-ramp.

I-95 Northbound and Exit Ramp 354B Detour

The I-95 northbound outside lane and exit ramp 354B will be closed from 8th Street to the MLK westbound exit ramp nightly starting Monday, June 3, through Sunday, June 9 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. for paving operations.

As a detour, drivers will take I-95 northbound to the Golfair Boulevard exit to I-95 southbound to the eastbound MLK exit.

Webber, LLC is estimated to complete the \$7.9 million interchange improvements by early 2027, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
